

Revolution! What works? What follows?

Currently, our world seems to be dominated by conflicts. Starting as a peacefully call for change, revolutions do not always end successfully. During this seminar we would like to look at the different outcomes of revolutionary movements e.g. in Central America, Syria, Libya, or Burkina Faso and ask under which circumstances it can turn out successfully or unsuccessfully.

First of all, we will learn about the **Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs)** and in particular about SDG 16.

On Saturday, we start the workshop by asking, how a revolution can be defined. This will be followed by the analysis of several revolutions which occurred in Central America. In particular, we will have a look on the revolutions in El Salvador and Nicaragua and compare them to less successful ones.

Based on the example of Burkina Faso we will see how a series of demonstrations, riots, civil resistance and civil disobedience led to the ousting of President Campaore. The prior revolutions will give a historical background and help us by answering the question how a revolution can be successful. However, we will also look at the process that follows the end of a revolution.

On Sunday, we will address the option of a military intervention and discuss in which cases the international community is allowed to act on the basis of the "Responsibility to Protect". Further, we will deal with the question how an intervention can be compatible with the achievement of SDG 16.
